## Prayer for the Day by Revd Canon David White

Grant, O God, that we may wait patiently as servants standing before their Lord to know your will; that we may welcome all truth; however it is expressed, that we may bless every good deed, whoever is the doer of it, that we may rise above all prejudice and party interest to the contemplation of eternal Truth and Goodness though the knowledge of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

This prayer was written by Charles Kingsley (1819-1875), who perhaps used to be best known as author of 'The Water Babies' and 'Westward Ho' (books that are out of favour today). Kingsley was an eccentric intellectual Victorian clergyman who, though he was also at different times Regius Professor of History at Cambridge, private tutor to the Prince of Wales and Chaplain to the Royal Family, was also a bundle of contradictions. He was a Christian socialist and obsessed with water and being clean. He supported sanitation reform to promote healthy drinking water for all so as to stop the spread of cholera amongst the poor - a sub-text in 'The Water Babies'. For him, cleanliness really was next to Godliness, seeking not just a clean outer body but a clean inner self as well.

However, today's prayer provides no indication that Kingsley was anything other than a priest who saw himself and all Christians as servants of God who are prepared to accept truth and goodness wherever they are found. Perhaps most important of all is the prayer's petition that 'we may rise above all prejudice and party interest' and seek God through Jesus our Lord, thereby striving for holiness and so avoiding the division that's so prevalent in society today.
